1. How we have used the PE and Sport Premium

During 2024–2025, we used the PE and Sport Premium to improve the quality of PE teaching, increase participation in sport, and broaden the range of physical activity opportunities available to pupils. Funding was allocated across three areas: **staff development (CPD)**, **internal school activities**, and **external activities and competitions**.

2. Breakdown of Spending

A. Staff CPD – £3,300

Impact

- Teachers and support staff gained confidence in delivering high-quality PE lessons.
- Online training strengthened planning, assessment and curriculum consistency.
- Coaching support improved subject knowledge and modelling of high-quality practice.

B. Internal School Activities – £6,077

Impact

- Increased participation in lunchtime and after-school clubs.
- More pupils accessed competitive opportunities within school.
- Additional swimming ensured more children met national curriculum expectations.
- New equipment improved lesson quality and supported inclusive practice.
- Digital resources enhanced teacher planning and pupil engagement.

C. External Activities – £7,837

Impact

- Pupils accessed a wider range of competitions and festivals.
- Increased representation at local sporting events.
- Specialist coaching enriched curriculum PE and broadened pupils' experiences.

3. How the Funding Contributed to the 5 Key Indicators

1. Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity

- New equipment (£2,617) increased active participation in lessons.
- Extra-curricular clubs (£716) supported less active pupils to take part.

2. Raising the profile of PE and sport across the school



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- Internal competitions (£716) promoted celebration and participation.
- External competitions (£2,517) strengthened school identity and aspiration.

3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of staff

- External coaching (£2,500) improved teacher subject knowledge.
- Online training (£800) ensured sustainable, ongoing development.

4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities

- Specialist coaches (£4,820) introduced pupils to new sports.
- Aquatic top-up lessons (£1,428) broadened water-based experiences.

5. Increased participation in competitive sport

- School Games membership (£500) expanded access to competitions.
- Inter-school events (£2,517) increased opportunities for pupils to represent the school.

4. Swimming Outcomes (Statutory Requirement)

Year 6 Swimming Data 2024–2025

- **81%** of pupils can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.
- **74%** of pupils can use a range of strokes effectively (for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke).
- **74%** of pupils can perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

5. Sustainability

Our investment in staff CPD ensures long-term improvement in PE teaching. Equipment purchases will continue to support high-quality lessons, and our partnerships with external coaches and the School Games network will help maintain a broad and ambitious PE offer.
